## New National Restrictions 5<sup>th</sup> November 2020

Dear Parents and Carers,

Over the past two weeks, it has become clear that we are now seeing a sustained rise in cases of COVID-19 in Lincolnshire and in East Lindsey in particular. I would like to remind all parents about the New National Restrictions, which have been in place since 5<sup>th</sup> November 2020.

Complying with the new measures will limit the spread of coronavirus, reduce the impact on the NHS and save lives. The measures include –

1. **Stay at home** – this means you must not leave or be outside of your home except for specific purposes such as childcare or education, for work purposes, to exercise outdoors, for medical reasons, shopping for basic necessities or visiting a member of your support bubble.
2. **Staying safe outside the home (Social Distancing)** - you should minimise time spent outside your home and when around other people ensure you are **2 metres** apart from anyone not in your household.
3. **Meeting with family and friends – You must not meet socially indoors or in a private garden with family and friends unless they are part of your household or support bubble.** A support bubble is where a household with one adult joins with another household. You ma

We are doing everything we can to make sure school is as safe as it possibly can be and it is so very important that everyone in our local community is complying with all the measures above.

I would like to remind parents of children in Year 4 to drop their child off at a spot in the car park and leave as soon as possible. This is to minimise parents becoming too physically close to Miss Oliver as she lets the children into the classroom via the Fire Door. Please do not take your child to the Fire Door: Miss Oliver will call them across once the pathway is clear.

I know things are very tricky for everyone at the moment, but we will get through this if we all work together. Please continue to follow '*hands, face, space*'. If anyone in your household develops symptoms, your whole household must self-isolate. **This means not leaving your house at all.** Anyone with symptoms must also immediately book a test.

Please inform school if your child or anyone in your household develops symptoms. Please also contact school if you are unsure of what to do. We are always here to explain the guidance, support you and your family and answer any questions you may have.
