Dear Parents,

On Tuesday 28th January, we would like to take Year 2 to visit Tattershall Castle to really bring our project, Dynamic Defenders to life! The visit will provide an opportunity for the children to see for themselves how important a castle was in defending its occupants and what life was like for those who lived there. The children will take part in three workshops; a tour of the castle, an exploration of games and toys that children in a Medieval castle would have played with and they will learn how to dance at a banquet!

We will be leaving school promptly at **9:00am** and we aim to be back by **3:15pm**.

Your child will need to wrap up warm for the visit – it's likely to be rather cold as there is no heating within the castle. Layers are recommended underneath School Uniform along with sensible footwear, gloves and a hat.

Children will require a packed lunch with a drink. You can order your child a packed lunch through The Farm Kitchen or your child can bring a packed lunch of their own.

The cost of the visit will be **£11.27** per child, which we are asking for as a voluntary contribution. Please make this payment via your ParentPay account (this will act as your permission for your child to attend the visit). If you have any problems with ParentPay, please speak with Mrs Day in the office Monday-Thursday.

Visits are organised to support children's learning and so we would really appreciate your support. Although contributions are voluntary, if we do not receive sufficient funding, the visit will unfortunately have to be cancelled. Governors have agreed that any pupil eligible for Pupil Premium will not need to contribute and the school will pay the contribution on their behalf.

As always, we would welcome any volunteers to help on the trip. If you are interested in helping on the trip, please let Mrs Day know in the office or come and see me on the playground at the end of the day. We will contact you nearer the time with more details.
