English

- Use brackets, commas and dashes to indicate parenthesis.
- Use expanded noun phrases to convey complicated information concisely.
- Use modal verbs and adverbs to indicate degrees of possibility.
- Use a variety of subordinating conjunctions.
- Write a diary.
- Use the perfect form of present tense verbs to mark relationships of time and cause.
- Check that a text makes sense to them, discussing understanding and exploring meaning of words in context.

Maths

- Multiply numbers up to 4 digits by a one- or two-digit number using a formal written method, including long multiplication for two-digit numbers.

- Multiply and divide numbers mentally, drawing upon known facts.
- Divide numbers up to 4 digits by a one-digit number using a formal written method and interpret remainders appropriately for the context.
- Multiply unit and non-unit fractions by an integer.
- Calculate fractions of an amount.
- Read, and write decimals up to two decimal places.
- Read and write decimals as fractions.

- To report findings from enquiries.
- Know that some materials will dissolve in liquid to form a solution and describe how to recover a substance from a solution.
- To use knowledge of solids, liquids and gases to describe how mixtures might be separated (including through filtering, sieving and evaporating).

To locate and describe the significance of the Great Barrier Reef.

Key Question: How can Brahman be everywhere and in everything?

- Consider who I am and what I mean to different people.
- Explain why Hindus believe Brahman takes on many forms.
- Explain some Hindu teachings about God.
- Explain how characteristics of Brahman present in different deities show how he can be everywhere and in everything.
- Explain how I see different aspects of myself in different roles.
- Explain how a belief in the importance of the living world might affect people's actions.

- Know about a range of jobs carried out by people I know and have explored how much people earn in different jobs.
- Identify a job I would like to do when I grow up and understand what motivates me and what I need to do to achieve it.
