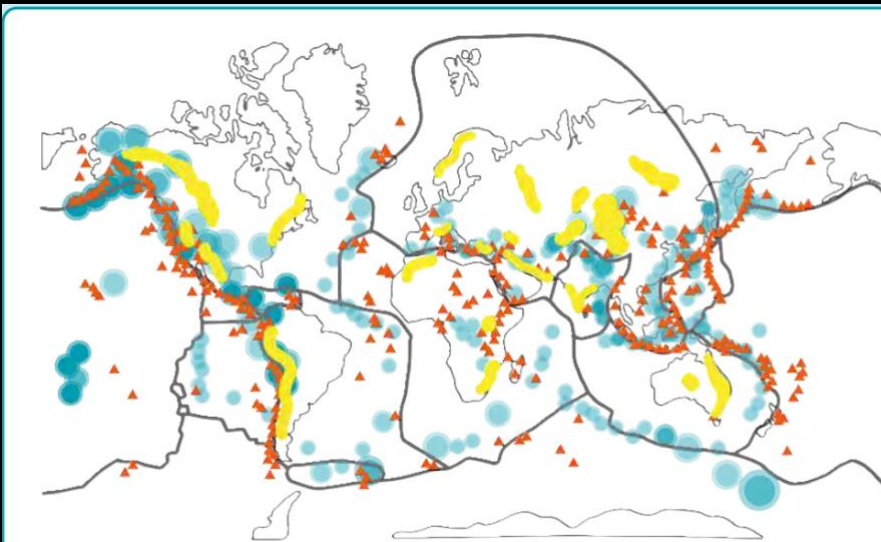

### English

- Identify word classes.

### Maths

#### GYMNASTICS – Body Management

- To demonstrate a range of balances using different body parts.

#### GAMES – Invasion

- To send and control a ball.
- To understand the need for evasion.

### PSHE - Being Me in My World

- To recognise my worth and identify positive things about myself and my achievements.
