### Communication and Language

- Recite rhymes.
- Use a wider range of vocabulary.
- Understand 'why' questions.
- Use talk to organise themselves and their play.



### Literacy - Reading

- Engage in conversations about stories.
- Recites rhymes:
  - *Polly Put the Kettle On*
  - *Jack and Jill*
  - *The Wheels on the Bus*
  - *Sleeping Bunnies*
- Develop phonological awareness to count syllables and recognise words with the same initial sound.

### Literacy – Writing

- Write some of their name.
- Begins to form some letters.
- Makes marks using large movements.

### Maths

- Recite numbers past 5. Link amounts to numeral.
- Understand positions through words alone.
- Identifies pattern and arranges objects.
- Show finger numbers up to five.
- Experiment with their own symbols and marks as well as numerals.

### Physical Development

- **PE Gymnastics- Climbing and Balancing**
- Skip, hop, stand on one leg and hold a pose for a game like musical statues.
- Collaborate with others to manage large items, such as moving a long plank safely, carrying large hollow blocks.
- Encourage children to use a knife and fork, when trying different foods.
- Teach children about healthy choices and sorting foods.

### Expressive Arts and Design

- Explore colour and mixing.
- Create and follow maps.
- Paint pictures.
- Use musical instruments to explore sounds.
- Sing the melodic shape (moving melody, such as up an own, down and up) of familiar songs.

- Become more outgoing with unfamiliar people, in the safe context of their setting.
- Develop appropriate ways of being assertive.
