English

We will be brushing up our writing skills by learning a vast array of writing techniques. We will write a non-chronological report on the narwhal whale, write diaries from the perspective of Robert Falcon Scott, and we'll write a dramatic narrative telling the tale of an excruciating journey to the South Pole.

Mathematics

We will be learning efficient written methods for all four of the operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Children will increase their understanding of place value to include numbers up to 10 million – including decimal and negative numbers.

Please do remind your child to come and ask for help in areas of Maths that they're finding tricky!

Things To Remember

Homework

Homework will be set on a Friday, and will consist of spellings, multiplication tables, reading, Grammar activities, Maths activities and, sometimes, projects based around Frozen Kingdom. Unless stated otherwise in your child's homework diary, homework will be due in the following Friday.

Please remember to sign your child's homework diary each week to show that you are aware of their home learning. Children can always come and ask me or Mrs Thomas for help with homework or ask for time at break time to complete it – please encourage them to do this themselves to help build their independence!

PE

PE sessions for this term will be on a Wednesday and Thursday. Please ensure that your child's PE kit comes into school on a Monday and goes home to be washed on a Friday (sometimes the PE timetable may change). Safe Cracker

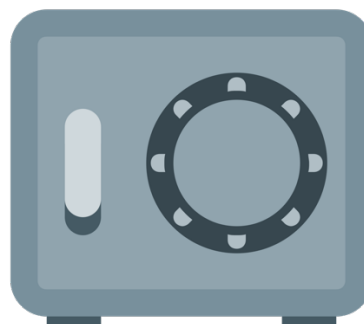
Every time a child reads to an adult at home within a week (Monday to Sunday) the following number of times, they earn safe unlock attempts if their Reading Record is signed:

3 times = 1 attempt

4 times = 3 attempts

5 times = 5 attempts

If they crack the four-digit code, they get to keep the contents of the safe as a reward for being such a devoted reader!



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
