



This term's project in Reception

Nature Detectives

If you go down to the woods today, you're in for a BIG surprise! During this project, we will explore forests and the types of animals and minibeasts that you would find in the woods.

What is lurking in the woods?

The children will investigate what minibeasts and woodland creatures live in the forest and woods and their life cycles. They will also learn about what plants and flowers need to grow and the parts of a flower.

Learning Launch

We will be going on an minibeast hunt!

How Can You Help?

- Share the knowledge organiser and recap the vocabulary with your child.
- Go on a woodland walk, looking at the trees and talking about the animals and minibeasts that live in the woods.
- Plant some seeds and talk about what plants need to grow.
- Go to the garden centre and look at different plants and flowers. Can you name each part of the plant?
- Watch videos of a butterfly's life cycle? What does the caterpillar go into before it turns into a butterfly?
- Share books with woodland animals, the woods or minibeasts in.
- Go on Bug Club and read the books and games allocated to support reading.

English

We will be revising Phase 3 phonics and moving onto Phase 4, which focuses on blends such as 'fr' 'tr' and reading and writing words with digraphs/trigraphs in e.g. ch, qu, air, igh. We will also be learning to read and write more non decodable words. The children will be focusing on building their writing up to simple captions and sentences. We will be focusing on the books We are going on a bear hunt by Michael Rosen, The Gruffalo by Julia Donaldson, The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle, Owl Babies by Martin Waddell and Little Red Riding Hood. We will be completing some writing tasks based on these stories.

Mathematics

This term we will be focusing on counting and ordering numbers to 20. We will be building numbers and creating patterns beyond 10. We will also be learning to add more and subtract two single digit numbers and record this a number sentence. We will also be learning about spatial reasoning, thinking about using positional language and recapping our 2D and 3D shape knowledge. Don't forget there is a new White Rose app (1 minute maths) that you can download and your child can play games to practice subitising and counting.
