Experiences, Visits & Visitors

- **Tea Party-** The Tiger Who Came To Tea. The children will get the chance to dress up as their favourite animal and come to our tea party.
- **Welly walk-** The children will take part in a welly walk around the village and the school grounds. We will be exploring the signs of seasonal change and the different types of plants that grow in our local area.

English

We will be writing instructions on how to care for a pet using information in books, online and through the videos recorded by Miss Field and Mrs Moody. We will be writing our own narratives, based on the book The Tiger Who Came to Tea. Finally, we will write invitations inviting Miss Brooks to our The Tiger Who Came to Tea themed tea party.

Mathematics

We will be recapping our knowledge of multiplication and division. This will include counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. We will be learning ways to support our multiplication and division by making and adding equal groups and creating arrays. We will also be focusing on fractions by understanding halves and quarters.

Homework

- Encourage your child to read regularly at home. Please record reading in your child's reading record book to let us know how they are getting on.
- Reading books will be changed regularly. Additional books can be found on Bug Club, along with spelling and grammar activities.
- In your scrapbook you will find termly family project activities. This includes 6 tasks to complete over the term (we ask that a minimum of 3 are completed).
- Your child will bring home a set of not fully decodable words. Practise reading these with your child regularly.

Please ensure that your child's PE kit comes into school on a Monday and goes home to be washed on a Friday (sometimes the PE timetable may change). When the weather is colder, we recommend tracksuit bottoms and jackets for outdoor PE sessions.
