#### Knowledge is Key!

Date:

Create a **fact-file** about one of the following topics:

- A Roman religion (gods and myths)
- Roman sports and leisure (gladiators, competitions)
- Roman towns (planning of houses and town planning)
- Roman homes (mosaics and food)
- Roman or Anglo-Saxon army (soldiers and road building)
- Roman clothing compared to Anglo-Saxon clothing

Make sure you try your best to stay neat and find out lots of facts! Bring an extra copy of your work to school so we can create a class book full of our fact-files!

#### Roman Inventions

Date:

Choose a Roman invention. **Illustrate and label** it to show how it worked. If you have the resources, you could create a mini version of it! Take a picture to put on Twitter or stick it in your scrapbook.
